n 2014, municipal finances in Quebec were marked by the presentation of a transitory fiscal pact by the current liberal government. This transition year was marked by the abolition of the local development centers (Centre local de dévelopment) and the regional councils (Conseil regional des élus) and by \$300 million dollars in budget cuts.

A small ray of sun in that grey sky will be the 50 million dollar increase in the program to support local road works, which will be shared according to priorities within the MRC of Memphremagog.

According to our provincial leaders, this is just the beginning. The government plans to end support of the Route Verte bike path network. The bike path crosses the Canton de Hatley, from Sherbrooke to the heart of North Hatley. The municipality was receiving \$19 500 per year for its maintenance. The government is also hinting at cuts of around 1.3 billion dollars in its transfers to municipalities.

It's not easy for administrations to have the government-set provincial requirements for municipalities, such as regional fire safety coverage, water treatment and road maintenance while it cuts funding.

During the last elections, one of our promises was to keep a low tax rate while maintaining healthy management practices. For 2015 the tax rate should drop by \$0.01. The rate will go from \$0.39 to \$0.38 per \$100 of evaluation. This drop can be explained by new homes construction.

Despite the reduced rate, we think our budget is rather conservative. In the last months, the government's aggressive approach to reduce costs creates uncertainty. It's important to us to continue, in 2015, to offer the same level of service.

I would like to thank municipal councillors, employees and all those worked for the development of our municipality.

The year 2014 saw many achievements thanks to the support of citizens like you. Finally, I would like to wish you Happy Holidays and the All the Best for 2015. May this year be filled with life's simple pleasures.



ECHOES FROM NOVEMBER 3, 2014 COUNCIL MEETING

1) CPTAQ request

Council supports Mr. Philippe Florentin's request to obtain a right of way for the road giving access to lot 3 907 376 to build a residence.

2) By-law 2014-18 concerning the prevention of zebra mussels and other invasive species

Council gives notice that a by-law will be adopted concerning the prevention of zebra mussels and other invasive species. The new by-law will include, among other things, the notion of *exotic invasive species*.

3) Pecuniary interests

Council members submitted their pecuniary interests.

4) Coaticook dump site budget adopted

The municipality adopted the budget presented by the Régie intermunicipale de gestion des déchets solides de la région de Coaticook, a budget of \$1 435 330, and representing a share of \$43 670 for the Canton de Hatley in 2015.

5) Bike path

To receive the subsidy for the maintenance of the bike path, the municipality confirmed the following:

- Destination Sherbrooke has the mandate to manage the bike path;
- There are 13.4 kilometers of Route Verte bike path on its territory;
- The bike path is accessible and free for all users.

6) Modification of use for lot 4 030 111

Council has accepted to make certain changes to the agreement with Mr. Bradley Mitchell, including removing the road status of lot 4 030 111.

7) Confirming the use of Monty Sylvestre services

Council authorized municipal representatives to make use of the services of the firm Monty Sylvestre, legal advisors, as needed for the period of January 1 to December 31.

8) RIEM by-law 2014-06

Council has authorized the modification of by-law 2014-06. The loan by-law for the construction of the water treatment plant and water supply pipes will be of \$9 400 000 in lieu of \$8 100 000.

9) Harfang de l'Estrie snowmobile club

Council has accepted the snowmobile club's

request to cross the roads Belvédère sud (near 3246) and Bel-Horizon (1555) for one (1) year, as long as the Ministry of Transport of Québec and property owners agree.

10) Bids for the firewall of the multifunctional building

The municipality received two (2) bids for the construction of a firewall for the multifunctional building located at 4765 chemin Capelton: Construction Yves Lessard for \$193 700 and Construction Guy Sébas for \$277 089. As the budgeted amount is around \$90 000, Council accepted neither of the bids received.

11) Contract given to Sentiers Boréalis

With the support from the Fonds des territories en difficulté (FSTD), council has awarded a contract to Sentiers Boréalis to plan and build multi-use trails on municipal land.

The multi-use trails will be located between Capelton road, the bike path and Kingdom road, near Mont Hatley. Multi-use trails are destined for year-round use for walking, running, cycling, skiing and snowshoeing.

12) Land acquisition request

The municipality received a request to buy lot 4 090376. Council refused the offer, as it would block off access to the public road of other properties.

ECHOES FROM NOVEMBER 11, 2014 SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

1) By-law 2010-10

Council accepted to make changes to by-law 2010-10 concerning the Plateau Massawippi loan by-law.

2) Hydraulic wheel excavator

The municipality issued a call for tenders for the acquisition of a hydraulic wheel excavator.

The municipality used a points system to evaluate the tenders in two steps. An evaluation chart allowed for points to be awarded according to the number of hours of usage, the year, the weight and the years of guarantee for the said equipment.

Council accepted the tender of CIMI inc. for the acquisition of Hydundai hydraulic wheel excavator.

ECHOES FROM THE DECEMBER 1ST 2014 MEETING

1) Right-of-way mandate -Eustis road

The municipality accepts to grant to Mr. Philippe Florentin for a 30 meter right-of-way on on lot n° 2 340 812 on Eustis road from Rodgers road.

2) By-law 2014-18 concerning the prevention of zebra mussels and other invasive species

Council adopted a by-law concerning the prevention of zebra mussels and other invasive species. The new by-law will include, among other things, the notion of *exotic invasive species*.

3) Régie des Eaux Massawippi budget is adopted

The municipality adopts the Régie intermunicipale des Eaux Massawippi budget, for \$1 101 600 which represents a share of \$106 915 for 2015.

4) Notice of motion for by-law n° 2014-19 to create a working capital fund

Notice of motion is given that by-law no 2014-19 to create a working capital fun will be presented for adoption at a later meeting.

5) Resolution n° 11-04-04-19 is modified

The Transports Ministry must acquire 18 lots totalizing 12 253,8 meters for the highway 410. The resolution is modified to include the name of the current mayor.

6) Subsidy for road improvement \$15 904 and \$8 139

Council has approved public works on Bel-Horizon, Hatley Acres, Hatley Centre and Smith for a total of \$392 804, for which there are subsidies for \$15 904 and \$8 139.

7) 2015 council meeting schedule

Council has adopted its 2015 meeting schedule. Meetings will be held Mondays at 7 p.m.: January 12th, February 2nd, March 2nd, April 13th, May 4th, June 1st, July 6th, August 3rd, September 14th, October 5th, November 2nd and December 7th.

2014 ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE REPORT



The Environment committee is made up of 9 members including two (2) elected officials and seven (7) citizens.

HERE ARE SOME OF THE COMMITTEE'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- As with all Canton de Hatley committees, each member has signed a code of ethics thus adhering to a vision and conduct of integrity and respecting rigorous moral standards, thus encouraging municipal transparency;
- The CCE (via the Municipality) has had its work recognized.

The «prix Méritas 2014». This prize was awarded to the municipality (among all Quebec municipalities with a population of 20 000 and less) in recognition of its contribution to environment protection over the last ten years. In the words of the Minister: «The prix Méritas rewards a municipality for its integrated approach to sustainable development, meaning that it has been a leader in participative planning and long term actions for its overall economic, social and environmental development.» Congratulations to all those who, over the past decade, have

worked hard to make Canton de Hatley as green as possible. The objective, when the committee was created was to bring forth tangible day-to-day actions that would eventually be part of municipal policies more in harmony with the environment.

- As in the previous years, there was compost distribution at Mont Hatley
- Part of the Massawippi River was cleaned with help of the cadets. It was a success: A container was two thirds filled with tires, barrels, metal, cans, etc. all cleared from the river bed.
- We visited the regional recycling center. Seeing where the content of our blue bins goes is very enlightening. This made us consider a new flyer explaining the dos and don'ts of day-to-day recycling. The results should be out soon.
- We've looked at what could be done before any development project is approved to ensure environmental protection. Results from this study should be available in 2015.
- Implementation of a mini eco-centre in the municipality was our main concern this year!

The process is long and delicate, as the environment is a question of conscience and not just economics, so we need to tread carefully.



We have worked on a preliminary project that still in process. We must consider the participation of other municipalities and convince Council of the idea. We'd like to see this happen in 2015.

In the meantime we highly recommend that citizens use the services of the Ressourcerie des Frontières. It's an exceptional organization that will pick up almost everything you want to get rid of, at home, for free. About 90% of everything picked up is re-used.

I would like to use this occasion to warmly thank all committee members for their regular attendance and their devotion to the environmental cause of the municipality. Through their efforts, they have contributed to making us individually and collectively more aware and environmentally responsible.

New at Mont Hatley Park - We'll be sliding from the mountain summit



Mont Hatley Park will start its second season by becoming the first alternative sliding centre in Quebec! After a first year and 15 000 visitors, the Park has added two new trails that will connect the summit to the base of the mountain. These trails will be for Zipfy and Threeskis, two types of mini-sleds that can be used by both children and adults and will be provided by Mont Hatley Park.

For the second season, Mont Hatley Park will still be offering its 10 sliding trails, each measuring 300 meters, two mechanical lifts and an improved Minitube section for small children. By offering mini-sled (Zipfy and 3-skis) sliding from the summit, the Park is

innovating by offering a service not available elsewhere. This will be done legally and safely with two patrollers at all times on the trails and an initiation area for those who wish to familiarize themselves with this type of sliding. Take note that helmets will be mandatory to access the summit. A rental centre will be set up and helmets will be available for customers

The season should open next December 20 and should be open Saturdays and Sundays and week days for school or corporate groups. During the Christmas holidays and school break the park will be open every day, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

HOW TO PREVENT FROSTBITE TO YOUR ANIMALS

Animals' resistance to the cold varies depending on the species. Are **particularly vulnerable to the cold:**

- cats
- small dogs or dogs with short-haired coats (Bichon, Chihuahua, hound, etc.)
- puppies and older dogs

Cats

Since we don't usually accompany our cats outside, it is difficult to control how long they stay out. When it's very cold, it is preferable to not let your cat outside; keep your feline in the warmth of your house.



Dogs

- Never leave your dog outside for long periods of time without someone to watch over it
- If your dog is small or has short hair, get it a coat and boots
- Once back inside, clean and dry its paws with a wet towel to clean off all residues of salt and calcium; those products can irritate or burn.
