#### Explanatory Notes:

- The cost of the Sûreté du Québec is financed at 50% by a property tax and at 50% by a service tax applicable to properties with buildings.
- The cost for fire protection is financed at 50% by a property tax and at 50% by a service tax applicable to properties with buildings.
- The cost for the emptying of the septic tanks, carried out every two years, is divided in two in order to be payable each year.
- The 3-way collection includes a single black waste bin for ultimate waste. Additional black bins are charged.
